# The Order of Service and Ceremony

The Colour Guard of Honour and the Pipe Band will parade the Colours from the Officers Club to the Chapel.

Let Thy wisdom be her guide, and let Thine arm strengthen her; let truth and justice, holiness and righteousness, peace and charity abound in her days. Direct all her counsels and endeavours to Thy glory and the welfare of her people; and let her always possess the hearts of her people. Let her reign be long and prosperous, and crown her with everlasting life in the world to come, through Jesus Christ Our Lord. Amen.
